ROTARY GROUP STUDY EXCHANGE VISIT TO BRAZIL

Would you value an opportunity to visit the tropical rain forests of Brazil, see the Amazon River, and learn about the culture, businesses and education of their people? Are you a young professional between the ages of 25 and 40? Then *Rotary District 6400* would like to talk to you about a month-long Exchange visit...and *Rotary* picks up the tab!

Led by a Rotarian team leader, this Exchange is open to four ***non-Rotarians*** only.

Applications are currently being accepted by all clubs in District 6400.

This Group Study Exchange will take place **April 1 thru April 30, 2006.**

The Exchange is designed to develop professional and leadership skills, and to better prepare participants to address the global needs of their own communities when they return.

It's a month-long program in which participants will travel throughout Northern Brazil, engage in professional exchanges, and tour business, cultural, and educational facilities they would never see as a tourist. **All travel and housing costs (and most other expenses) are covered by Rotary and Rotarians.**
