For those of you who missed the presentation, we think it is important to recognize some of his accomplishments: Past President Rotary (1918), "Silver Acorn Award" from the Lieutenant Governor of Ontario for his work with Scouts Canada, one of the original founding members of "the Friends of the Court" which saved Mackenzie Hall from demolition, the "Man of Peace" award from the YMCA, National President of Save the Children Canada, President of The Children's Safety Village, Chair of the Windsor Chamber of Commerce, and delegate to the 16th annual AIDS Conference in Toronto.

Past recipients have included Evelyn Slobasky, Mary Hall and John McGivney.
