GRANT WORKSHOP - August 23, 2007

District 6400 of Rotary International will be holding a free workshop on Thursday, August 23, 2007, at Schoolcraft Community College. It will be held from 7PM to 9PM in the VisTaTech Center, room VT-425 (the strategic bay room). The college is located on the east side of Haggerty Road between 6 and 7 mile roads. The VisTaTech Center is the first building coming from the north.

This workshop will cover the Rotary Foundation Grants programs, with a special emphasis on the District Simplified Grants program, Volunteer Service Grants, and Matching Grants. We will also discuss other sources of funding for your projects including money available from the World Community Service District Matching Grant.
