LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Kevin Marshall and Andy Pears spoke about 'Greening the Hospital' project. They developed a plan called the energy stewardship to help reduce the energy budget and increase awareness about saving energy among the staff. They started by removing all mercury from the thermometers and blood pressure cuffs, making it a mercury safe hospital. Secondly, they created a 'green team' as a front line to head off the project. They went ahead and minimized the use of pesticides and some aggressive chemical cleaners. They also teamed up with other environmental initiatives in the Windsor Essex County region. They started an aggressive recycling program, saving nearly 350,000 plastic bottles per year that would have otherwise been thrown away. They also recycle lighting, install light-saving measures by sensor and special water saving components, saving nearly 240,000 litres. It is the goal of Windsor Regional Hospital to be not just a leader in the healthcare field, but a community and national leader as well.
