LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Former member Dr. Saad Y. Jasim is CEO of the Walkerton Clean Water Centre (WCWC), an organization that is dedicated to the world class delivery of safe and secure drinking water. WCWC is the triumph that has arisen from the tragedy of Walkerton's tainted water disaster and Saad was hand selected to lead the centre; in the quest to deliver on the 120 recommendations that arose from the Walkerton Inquiry led by Justice O'Connor.

The benefits of Dr. Jasim's research and innovation have global impact such as training courses to offer certification in safe water delivery, identifying water loss in systems that have shown up to 35% water loss, assistance for all sizes of systems (including First Nations) not just major populations, mobile training and testing projects, and a research centre that was in large part funded by the suppliers of the water industry making WCWC unique in the world. Common denominators for a healthy population are clean air and water. Clean water is a growth industry and there will be a critical demand for professionals over the next 10 to 15 years. To that end WCWC is partnering with select universities, including our own University of Windsor, to offer scholarships, research and partnered research grants up to and including PhD levels of \$25,000.00 per year.
