**BIRTHDAY CHALLENGE - END POLIO NOW** - To celebrate Rotary's 103rd anniversary, the words "end polio now" were projected on the exterior of the Houses of Parliament in London on February 23. That was the day that RI launched its \$100 Million Challenge to match the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation's \$100 million grant for polio eradication. "Each Rotary club is being asked to contribute at least \$1,000 annually to the challenge for the next three years." says Robert Scott, chair of the International PolioPlus Committee. "The \$200 million that will be generated will be a vital catalyst in support of polio eradication." In 2007, more than 400 million children were immunized against polio in 27 countries through the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, of which Rotary is a spearheading partner, and the disease is now endemic in only four countries: Afghanistan, India, Nigeria, and Pakistan.

**ROTARY DISBURSES FIRST \$40 MILLION** - Nine countries and two World Health Organization regions have received The Rotary Foundation's first distribution from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation's US\$100 million challenge grant for polio eradication. Made in January, the \$40 million disbursement is Being used by WHO and UNICEF to carry out immunization activities in the four remaining polio-endemic countries - Afghanistan, India, Nigeria and Pakistan - plus five others where 'imported' polio cases have been reported. Surveillance and technical support are also being funded in WHO's African and Eastern Mediterranean regions. ....
