Program June 22, 2009 4-Way Test Presentation

Don Marsh introduced our speakers' topic today: a Four Way Test project based on the book, *Elijah of Buxton* by Christopher Paul Curtis.

Kay Curtis, Chair of the Youth Services Committee then provided a description of the project, a story-writing contest for children in grades 3 to 8 in the City of Windsor. The students submitted stories applying the Four Way Test, with the winner being chosen by Christopher Curtis. Eighteen finalists were chosen and took a bus trip to visit the Buxton National Historic Site and Museum. Kay also presented a PowerPoint slide presentation of photos from the trip and described how deeply moved were the visitors by the interpretation centres relating to Buxton as a terminus of the Underground Railroad.

The winner of the contest, Mr. Charith Jayatilaka, received an iPod Touch. Other prizes were contributed by Scholastic Books of Canada and St. Clair College. In addition to Mr. Jayatilaka, the other three finalists were his sister, Ms. Kumundu Jayatilaka, Mr. Clarke Gallie and Ms. Anna Chen. Ms. Chen was writing an exam and could not attend the meeting. The other finalists read their stories, which were all very well received by Club members. The finalists were presented with framed certificates noting their accomplishment.

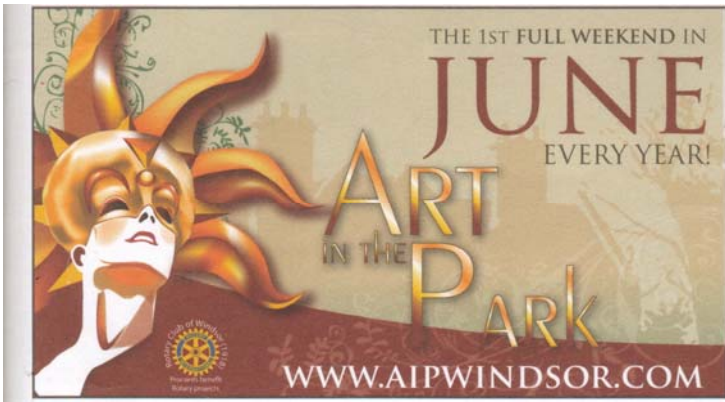
