- The advancement of international understanding goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service

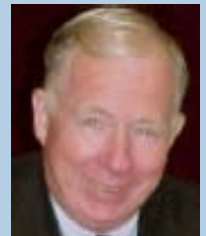
