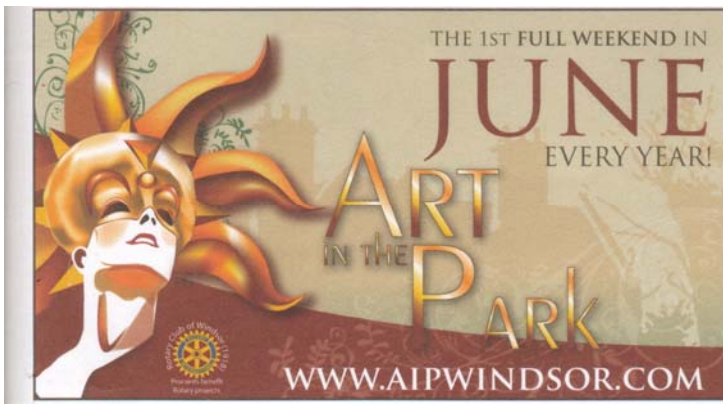

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

PDG Bob Gallagher have an excellent presentation updating members on monies raised and spent by the Rotary Foundation during the past year. The Foundation raised \$196million worldwide, of which \$91million was for 'End Polio Now', \$95million was for the Annual Programs Fund and \$10million was for The Permanent Fund. He said '...but it's not the amount of money raised, it's what the money can do'. One of the most exciting new partnerships is with US AID called H2O. 1.1 billion people in the world don't have clean water to drink. This program funds clean water programs around the world.

END POLIO NOW: Today, there are only 4 endemic countries, Nigeria, Afghanistan, Pakistan and India, left in the world. On a National Immunization Day (NID), 172 million children are immunized! Support 'Polio Plus', **take part in a NID in India on February 4-22, 2010.** Learn more about this trip at www.poliovision2010.org - you will give drops to children, go on a tiger safari, ride an elephant, visit New Delhi and Mumbai, and donate money along the way. You'll need one suitcase for your clothes and one suitcase filled with eye-glasses to be donated. **The cost of the trip is \$4,750 Cd.**

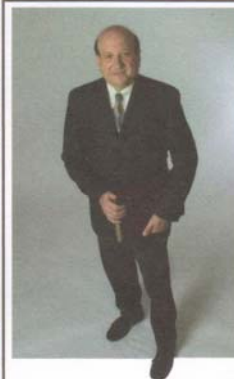
