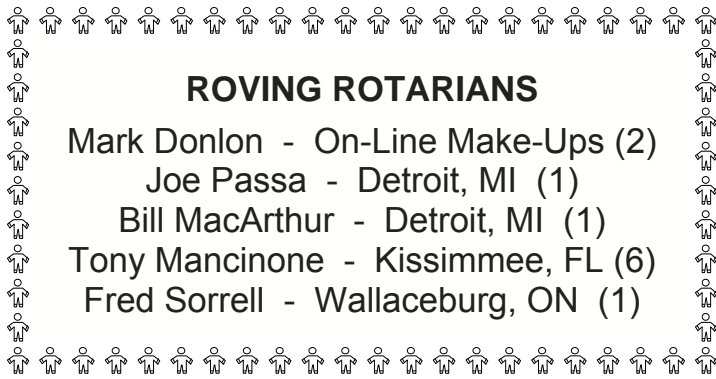
LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM
