Third-year visual arts student at the University of Windsor, and current President of our Rotaract Club, **Alex Kais**, will begin studies at the University of Hertfordshire, in September, as a Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship recipient. Alex calls the experience ‘the opportunity of a lifetime’.

‘I want to take advantage of being in Europe to increase my creativity as an artist,’ says Alex, who specializes in print-making.

Under the terms of his scholarship, he will serve as a Goodwill Ambassador and is expected to give presentations about Canadian life to Rotary clubs and other groups.

Alex says that he is inspired by the mission of ‘Service Above Self’.

And he takes Service seriously. So much so, that his time in England, which involves adjusting to a new culture and school while keeping up his Ambassadorial responsibilities to Rotary, may seem like a break. Here in Windsor, in addition to a full course load and the presidency of the Rotaract Club, he holds down a teaching assistantship in art history, works as the STEPS program coordinator in the Education Development Centre, and volunteers for Students Orienting Students. Off-campus, he’s performing in the Windsor Light Musical Theatre production of Willy Wonka, coming up this spring.
