Researcher Jessica Sartori of the United Way/ Centraide, Windsor- Essex County unveiled The 2009 Community Well-Being Report. This report looks at a range of socio-economic and health indicators and found that 10% of local families and 16% of children live below the poverty line, defined as an annual income of \$28,091 per family of four. Food bank usage has increased dramatically but the average paycheck has decreased by \$200 over the last decade.
