Dr. Roman Maev, University of Windsor Professor, and Chairholder of the NSERC/Chrysler/University of Windsor Industrial Research Chair in Applied Solid State Physics and Material Characterization, was our guest speaker. Dr. Maev gave an informative and very detailed presentation on the application of nondestructive evaluation technology for solving crucial quality control problems such as the development on in-line monitoring systems for advanced manufacturing processes. Dr. Maev's research involves the use of sound waves to look into materials and to display the results in an easy-to-interpret image on a computer screen. His innovations have led to developments such as integrating acoustic imaging equipment into welding tools, thereby providing an instant record and read-out of the quality of each weld during production.
