(Taken from the Speaking Notes for Rotary meeting January 18, 2010 by Shari Cunningham)

"The next couple of days are sight seeing and we get to ride camels in the Samode and visit the Rotary Tented Camp and see the Amber Fort on elephants.

On the 11th we visit the Jaipur Foot Hospital - they deal with amputations. After that we go to the one of the great wonders of the world, the Taj Mahal, and tour the city of AGRA.

Two days later, we visit a Centre for treating physically challenged persons. It is called the Rotary Viklang Kendra.

Next off to the famous Corbett Tiger Reserve then on to Mumbai via overnight train.

We will be meeting with Rotary groups in Mumbai and then we head home on February 21st.

We arrive home on Monday morning - but don't expect to see us at the meeting!"
