Lex McCrindle gave a Memorial Tribute to the late Roy Lancaster, a longtime Rotarian and Past District Governor.

Kay Curtis introduced speaker, Bob Gallagher, as the speaker, noting his strong involvement in Rotary and that he will be receiving an award (one of ten worldwide) at the upcoming Rotary meeting in Montreal. Bob spoke about the trip to India, last February, through which the Rotarians participated in national Polio immunization day, visited various clinics and travelled to significant historic sites in India as well as having delivered 1,250 pairs of donated eyeglasses. 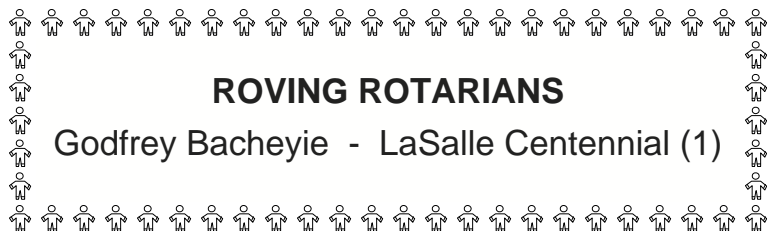
