Jennifer Jones welcomed the group, noting that it was extraordinary to see the new Rotary home which will be a safe place for children in our community. She described Maryvale's work by reference to a letter from a grateful mother of an autistic teenager. The mother expressed her gratitude for her child's participation in Maryvale's Autistic program and for the respite care program noting that both her son and her family benefitted. Jennifer explained that Maryvale makes it possible for families to live in a productive way, with Maryvale staff able to help children in crisis and, through the the Rotary Home at Maryvale, able to provide a 24 hour centre. She thanked Rotarian Norm Wheeler for his leadership in establishing the original Rotary Home and noted that the short stay program means that between 160 and 225 children and teenagers from our own community will be able to benefit from the award winning program which has resulted in an increased attention to the needs of children and specifically has led to an increase in the number of child psychiatrists on site, who now number six. She introduced members of the Board of Directors for Maryvale, who were present at the dinner, including: Gordon Orr, Ruth Stuart, Paul Vasey, Cathy Mombourquette and Denise Hrastovac.

Connie Martin and President Bill then unveiled a new plaque for the Rotary Cottage in recognition of the Rotary Club of Windsor (1918)

The evening concluded with the Cottage Four Choir performing.
