LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Our own, Dr. Saad Jasim, P. Eng., Director, Great Lakes Regional Office International Joint Commission, discussed our Great Lakes and the quality of the water. The focal point of his discussion was the International Joint Commission. There are 3 commissioners appointed, per country. Among other sub topics, Dr. Jasim discussed the Boundary Water treaty which was signed in 1909 and which regulates pollution control provisions, public involvement, and permits the IJC to conduct studies. He then presented some interesting facts about the Great Lakes: provides water for 40 million people, 20% of the world's water supply, and borders 2 nations, 8 states and 2 provinces.
