The recipient of the Eli Goldin Memorial Rotary Ideal of Service Award was Connie Martin, for her tireless work for both the Club and the community. Well deserved, Connie!

Kim Spirou, VP Communications & Development, Hotel Dieu Grace Hospital and Dr. Amr Morsi, Interventional Cardiologist, introduced Hotel Dieu Grace Hospital's newest fundraising campaign, a \$78.3million hospital expansion which will include a state-of-the-art Angioplasty Centre, facilities for medical students and residents as well as a relocation of current hospital functions. Dr. Morsi and his colleague have performed over 600 angioplasties this year in the hospital's current facilities. Expansion would allow more interventional cardiologists to be recruited and greatly increase the ability to perform angiograms and angioplasties in the same visit. The hospital Foundation has already raised \$8.5million out of the \$12.5million goal from the community. Members were asked to spread the word, consider volunteering and making a donation towards improving this service for our community.
