LAST MEETING'S PROGRAM

PP Rick Caron introduced and pinned Karen Feltham with a Paul Harris Fellow.

George Bezaire, from Imperial Oil, spoke about the four key issues surrounding Canada's Oil Sands and responsible development. The first point he emphasized is that the world is going to need more primary energy. He stated that this was attributed to an increased population, globally being more successful and that energy is being used more efficiently. The second point is that Canada is in a good position in the world for oil production because of our oil sands. He said we are third in the world in regard to oil sands. Not only that, he reported that within Canada, tapping this resource would result in job creation. He spoke about the environmental measures that Imperial Oil is implementing and that this is being accomplished through research and technology, planting trees, reducing emissions and responsible use of water. Finally, he spoke of their new investment onto the Kearl Oil Sands Project which will raise the bar on technology and environmental issues.
