## LAST MEETING'S PROGRAM

Guest Speaker DG Michael Duben's first experience with Rotary was as an Exchange Student in 1995. In 1996 he joined the St. Clair Rotary club. In 2009 he climbed Mt. Kilimanjaro and raised funds for mosquito netting in Africa. He picked (1918) as his first club to speak to because we are the current Dick Hedke award winning club. He said (1918) is known for what it accomplishes - '...clubs all over the world would love to have the success (1918) has...'. DG Michael also shared the theme of incoming RI President which is 'Reach Within to Embrace Humanity.' He also encourages us to 'Embrace Change', a pilot project for recruiting and diversity.

DG Michael presented notable facts such as (1918) has contributed over \$1,024,000 to RI over it's lifetime. Also, Charity Navigator, an organization which ranks charities world wide, shows Rotary is one of the top 3 charities in the world. He noted membership is growing in most parts of the world but is down in North America. Each Rotarian should try and recruit 1 new member this coming year, he said. Also, he would like to see every Rotarian contribute to the \$100 per Rotarian per year challenge.
