3. Lex McCrindle reported that over \$8,000 was donated to the Annual Programs Fund for the 3 to 1 drive held on February 23. This brings our Club's total yearly donations to over \$16,000

## LAST MEETING'S PROGRAM

Mark Campbell & Shawn Talbot of the Art in the Park marketing committee gave a presentation, which included a look at a new website launched and a 'Black Box Campaign'/new logo campaign which allows the artists to help us define 'What is Art'. The marketing committee is looking into live streaming of content onto the website from AIP. The facebook page is live now, so "like" it and "share" it.

Elaine Whitmore & Laurie Lessard spoke about the services that the John McGivney Children's Centre provides for children, including occupational therapy, speech therapy, physiotherapy, social work, pre-school and school. Laurie discussed research in pediatric rehabilitation being conducted on site, as well as best practices group and activities. The new JMCC allows for increased treatment space, family meeting rooms, a sheltered outdoor play space, a family resource centre, larger classrooms, a gym and a toy lending library. They thanked our Club for all their support over the years. The Centre is now serving more than 2,000 children
