### LAST MEETING'S PROGRAM

Youth Exchange Minute with our new Exchange Students, Sandra Salo from Finland and Weder Soares de Oliveira from Brazil.

David Musyj, CEO, Windsor Regional Hospital (WRH), gave a spirited, attention-grabbing presentation about healthcare business in general; but especially 'Where we were, where we are, and where we are going' with reference to healthcare provincially and locally. He agreed with the auditor general's report that healthcare needs to be first but disagreed with the cuts proposed. Giving a string of facts, he pointed out that there are over 68,000 emergency room visits per year but only 719 beds. With a budget of \$303million, WRH has a staff of 3,000 and 500 physicians on its payroll, with 700 volunteers. WRH's vision is "Outstanding Care .. No Exception", short and sweet, modeled after Mayo Clinic's philosophy. He said we want to protect our patients and we want to be the best. 'We have looked around', he said 'for the best practices and we have incorporated many suggestions given by staff and users of the facility. We are accountable and we are transparent. We have put online performance indicators online for the world to see....' He went on to cite some of the changes that have been implemented at WRH for better service. He said that politicians are talking changes meaning, 'cut, cut, cut' but there are alternatives which politicians should be considering, such as establishing ambulatory clinics outside the hospital, eHealth issue, paperless health records, to name a few.

In conclusion, he said we have a fantastic system. We need to save it and improve it. He thanked Rotary for their contributions to the Windsor Health Science Centres, particularly Windsor Regional Hospital.
